## 2026 TREE & SHRUB INFORMATION

### SOFTWOODS

**American Larch** (*Larix laricina*): 40-80' tall. Full sun, moist to wet soils. Deciduous conifer, drops needles in fall.

**Balsam fir** (*Abies balsamea*): 40-75' tall and 15-25' wide. Partial/full shade, moist, well-drained, acidic soils.

**Fraser Fir** (*Abies fraseri*): 30-50' tall. Partial/full shade, moist, well-drained, acidic soils.

**White spruce** (*Picea glauca*): 40-60' tall and 10-20' wide. Full sun/partial shade, well-drained soils.

**Eastern White Pine** (*Pinus Strobus*): 50-80' tall. Full/partial sun, rich, moist, well drained acidic soils.

**Eastern white cedar** (*Thuja occidentalis*): 25-40' tall and 10-12' wide. Sun/partial shade, moist, well-drained/wet soils. Needs consistent moisture during its first year and dry spells.

### HARDWOODS

**Red Maple** (*Acer rubrum*): 40-60' tall. Full sun, can tolerate wide range of soils but prefer moist acidic soil. Keep soil consistently moist during first year.

**Sugar Maple** (*Acer saccharum*): 60-75' tall and 40-50' wide. Sun/partial shade & well drained soils. Good source for maple syrup.

**Allegheny Serviceberry** (*Amelanchier laevis*): 60-75' tall. Grows well in full sun to partial shade, prefers moist, well-drained, slightly acidic soil, moderate growth rate.

**River Birch** (*Betula nigra*): 40-70' tall. Thrive in full sun to partial shade, preferring moist, acidic soils, but are adaptable to a range of conditions.

**Red Osier Dogwood** (*Cornus sericea*): 6-9' tall. Full sun to partial shade, prefers moist, well-drained soil.

**American Hazelnut** (*Corylus americana*): 8-12' tall. Grow best in full sun to partial shade in a variety of soil types, as long as they are moist and well-drained. For a good nut harvest, plant at least two to three genetically distinct bushes for cross-pollination, as they are not self-fertile.

**Sycamore** (*Platanus occidentalis*): 75-100'. Full sun/partial shade, tolerates various soils, prefers deep, moist, rich soil.

**Swamp White Oak** (*Quercus bicolor*): 50-60' tall & wide. Full sun, wet soil. Acorns valuable food for wildlife; hard timber.

**Arrowwood** (*Viburnum lentago*): 6-10' tall. Prefers full sun to partial shade and moist, well-drained soil.

### CONSERVATION PACKS

**Edible Fruit:** 2 each - Blackberry, Blueberry - Jersey, Blueberry - Blue ray, Raspberry, Strawberry.

**Evergreen:** 2 each - Colorado Blue spruce, Fraser Fir, White Spruce, Balsam Fir, White Pine.

**Lavendar Pack:** 2 each – Fred Boutin, Hidcote, Munstead, Provence.

**Bird & Butterfly:** 2 each – Black Chokeberry, Elderberry, Liatris Spicata, Ninebark, Apricot Beauty Daylily.

**Native Flowering:** 2 each - White Flowering Dogwood, Elderberry, Serviceberry, Red Osier dogwood, Eastern Redbud.

**Nut Tree Pack:** 2 each – White Oak, Bur Oak, Sawtooth Oak, Red Oak, Black Walnut.

**Ornamental Flowering:** 2 each - Ninebark, American Cranberry, Lilac, Redbud, White Flowering Dogwood.

### FRUIT

**Honeycrisp apple:** Mid-season flower. Sweet/tart flavor, crisp texture. Cross pollinates with Fuji.

**Fuji apple:** Mid-to-late-season flower. Sweet, mellow, crisp all-purpose apple. Cross pollinates with Honeycrisp.

**Blueberry – Jersey:** Self-pollinating but better yields if cross pollinated. Late summer fruiting. Crack resistant.

**Raspberry – Latham red:** Large easy to pick red fruit. Adapts to a wide range of soil and cold hardy.

Seckel Pear – Mid-season flower. Small dessert quality pear, ultra sweet flavor & fine texture, reliable productivity.

- **No refunds** will be given for orders not picked up. We recommend that early pick up of stock and same day planting will help ensure survivability. If you can't do this, heel the plants immediately into the ground for a short duration. Storing plants in a bucket of water is not recommended.
- **The District will refund orders** for stock that is unavailable and **ONLY IF SUBSTITUTIONS CANNOT BE MADE.**
